Dr. Anthony Stone

Dr. Stone is a family physician who has delivered care to patients at Lakeridge Health since 1992. His community practice is located in Bowmanville. He completed his undergraduate and post-graduate medical training the University of Toronto and received his certification from the College of Family Physicians of Canada in 1992. He is the Interim Regional Director of Clinical Education for Queen's University at Lakeridge Health. He also serves as Lead Physician for the Clarington FHO. Dr. Stone is an Adjunct Assistant Professor with Queen's University Faculty of Medicine and regularly preceptors residents for the ROMP program. Dr. Stone and his family have resided in Durham Region since 1970.



Dr. Kavita Sridhar

Dr. Kavita Sridhar is an Intensive Care physician at Lakeridge Health Oshawa and the Education Lead for the Department of Critical Care. She did the majority of her training at the University of Ottawa, followed by a Critical Care fellowship in Calgary. Upon returning to Ontario, Dr. Sridhar completed a Master's Degree in Bioethics at the Joint Centre for Bioethics, University of Toronto, while working as a Clinical Associate at Toronto's Mount Sinai Hospital. She holds the position of Assistant Professor at Queen's University and is the co-chair of Lakeridge's Bioethics Committee.
